He was designated a Rule 31 Mediator by the Tennessee Supreme Court in 1997 and served on the mediation panel for the U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of Tennessee from 1994 until 1998 and was reinstated in 2015.

In 1998, he was elected Chancellor, Part II, Sixth Judicial District, State of Tennessee and was re-elected in 2006. He retired on August 30, 2014 and returned to private practice where his concentration is on alternative dispute resolution. He is a member of the Knoxville Bar Association, where he served one term on the Board of Governors, and a member of the Tennessee Bar Association. He is a member of the Hamilton Burnette American Inn of Court. He is a Fellow in the Knoxville and Tennessee Bar Foundations.

From 2008-2010, he served as adjunct professor at the University of Tennessee College of Law where he taught Pre-trial Litigation. In 2016, he served as adjunct professor at the Duncan School of Law, Lincoln Memorial University teaching Trial Advocacy. He has presented at numerous seminars and has lectured at the Judicial Academy for new judges in the Tennessee Judicial Conference.

He currently serves as Vice-Chair of the Advisory Board of The Salvation Army, Knoxville Area Command. He is the Chair of the Board of Directors of the Museum of Appalachia.
