Judge Diane O. Leasure is retired from the 5th Judicial Circuit (Howard, Anne Arundel and Carroll counties) where she served as the Fifth Circuit Administrative Judge and the County Administrative Judge for the Circuit Court for Howard County for almost 10 years. Prior to her 16 years as a Circuit Court judge, she was a Principal of Fossett & Brugger, Chartered where she was the Chair of the Litigation Practice Group. Her practice was primarily concentrated in the areas of construction, business and franchise litigation.

Judge Leasure was a member of the Conference of Circuit Judges, including serving as its Chair in 2008-2010, was a member of the Judicial Cabinet and the Judicial Council and was an Inaugural Science and Technology Fellow in The Advanced Science and Technology Adjudication Resource Center (ASTAR).
