Lana began his legal career clerking for the Honorable James E. Moore and later entered private practice with a focus on general civil litigation in South Carolina's state and federal courts. His experience includes asbestos litigation, breach of contract, premises liability, insurance, real estate and toxic torts.

An active member of the South Carolina Bar, Lana is a past president of the Young Lawyers Division of the Bar and recently served a two-year term as a South Carolina State Delegate to the American Bar Association House of Delegates. He has been a member of the Workers' Compensation Section of the Bar since its inception, and currently serves on the Section Council. Lana is past president of the South Carolina Bar Foundation, recently completing a six-year term on its Board of Directors. He also serves on the Board of Directors of the South Carolina Workers' Compensation Educational Association.

In the community, Lana is an active member of Saint Joseph Catholic Church and also participates in the South Carolina Bar program for "iCivics" - taking fundamental civics education into local area middle schools.

Among the people Lana most admires are his parents – his father married his mother while he was serving in the Navy stationed in Panama, and eventually, he became one of the first lobbyists to work at the State House in South Carolina, representing the railroad industry. Lana's mother was his professional assistant until his death in 1977. She was asked to continue in the role as lobbyist for the SC Railroad Association (and later CSX) and remained until her retirement one of the most respected pioneer female lobbyists in South Carolina and Washington, DC. Their success at work, much as with raising four children, was based on sincerity, strong moral character, and trust.
