From 1995 to 2015, Mark Aceto served as a Superior Court Judge in Maricopa County. Mark presided over civil calendars for nine and a half years. For two years, beginning in 2006, he served as the Presiding Judge of the court's civil department. He also presided over calendars in the court's family, probate and criminal departments. On each of these assignments he presided over numerous settlement conferences. He has also served as a neutral in the Arizona Court of Appeals Settlement Conference Program.

Mark graduated with honors from both Villanova University in 1977 and from the Arizona State University College of Law in 1980. He is a member of the State Bar of Arizona. He is also admitted to US District Court and to the 9th Circuit Court of Appeals.

After working as a prosecutor for seven years, Mark joined the Liability Management Section of the Arizona Attorney General's Office in 1987. For the next eight years, his practice focused on defending physicians employed or insured by the state. The great majority of Mark's clients were attending and resident physicians at the University of Arizona College of Medicine.
